



Anthony and Samuel
Car Washers, Peru.

Anthony and Samuel are 10 year old brothers who work as car washers on Avenue Izaguirre in Lima, Peru a busy corner full of honking trucks and cars. They find Avenue Izaguirre a good place for cars as "the police do not bother them there and the drivers always pay".



The boys work from 8am to 12 and then go to school in the afternoons where Samuel prefers Math and Religious Studies and Anthony prefers Spanish lessons. They intend to stay in school. They each make about 9-10 solas a day (about \$5 Canadian) which they give to their Mother to buy clothes and to pay for school for themselves and their 6 year old brother Michael.

When asked about the Street Kids International Street Business Toolkit workshop the boys said it gave them ideas for earning and saving more money which they then shared with their Mother and they learned "a lot" about how to take better care of themselves.
