We team with youth workers to develop locally relevant, innovative workshops using award winning animations that engage young people about entrepreneurship, sexual health and drug use.

We operate primarily as a capacity builder in partnership with a broad array of agencies serving the children and youth that live and work on the streets in developing and transitional countries. In any given year, Street Kids International is active in several countries, developing and implementing programmes in association with local youth workers, their organizations and the youth they serve.

Having reached more than 2 million street kids in over 60 countries Street Kids International has been recognised by the United Nations as a Global Best practice leader in youth work.

Street Kids International was founded in Canada in 1988. As part of a commitment to increase the reach and scale of our unique programming Street Kids International, UK was incorporated in 2008.

Volunteer Fundraising Committee Member Role Description.

Overall Purpose

The Fundraising Committee is made up of Trustees and other volunteers who support Street Kids UKs strategic goals to increase the reach and scale of Street Kids International programming by maximising income and making use of all resources to support the growth of Street Kids International, UK. The committee meets in Central London on a quarterly basis. Further meetings and calls are held on an ad hoc basis. Expectation is for 1-2 days a month of work.

Committee Members Responsibilities

- ~ Promote and develop the charity in order for it to grow and maintain its relevance.
- ~ Use personal skills and experience as needed to ensure fundraising activities are well-managed and efficient.
- ~ Comply with the requirements of legislation and other regulators (if any) which govern the activities of the charity.
- ~ Act with integrity, and avoid any personal conflicts of interest or misuse of charity funds or assets.
- ~ Use charitable funds and assets reasonably, and only in furtherance of the charity's objects.
- ~ Avoid undertaking activities that might place the charity's funds, assets or reputation at undue risk.
- ~ Act in the best interest of the charity, beneficiaries and future beneficiaries at all times.
- ~ Maintain absolute confidentiality about all sensitive/confidential information received in the course of volunteering with the charity.

Reporting.

The Chair of the Fundraising Committee is a member of the Board of Trustees and reports to the Board of Trustees on the activities of the committee.
